SR 32 Relocation Project Update November 24, 2014

Earlier this month, the Consensus Building Institute (CBI) and U.S. Institute for Environmental Conflict Resolution (USIECR) completed the Situation Assessment for the proposed SR 32 Relocation project and submitted it to the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) Administration for review and consideration.

The Situation Assessment summarizes the varying views and perspectives of just over 100 project stakeholders, many of whom represent federal and state regulatory agencies. It also offers a set of possible options for moving forward with the project. **It does not assess the merit of the SR 32 Relocation project nor does it provide a recommendation for whether or not the project should be advanced for further development and construction.**

Status Update

FHWA and ODOT Administration have completed an initial review of the Situation Assessment and have determined that clarification related to potential environmental

issues raised by several key state and federal regulatory agencies is required. During the next couple of months, they will work closely with CBI, USIECR and agency representatives to obtain the information and clarification needed prior to deciding how to proceed with the proposed project. No final decisions will be made until this process has concluded.
